I know no death, yet I am born again with every morn—with every noon—with every twilight. I leap into fresh being with every new world's event.

Those who created me cease to be—the brains and the heart-blood that nourish me go the way of human dissolution today. Yet I live on—and on. Sublime in my power—Terrible in am majestic in my strength—my Potentialities—yet as democratic as the ragged boy who sells me for a penny.

DAMN. A contributor to the Sun grieves over the ignorance of those who assume that tinker's dam is a "profane" expression. "A tinker's dam," says he, was a chunk of dough or batter used before the days of mastic acid to keep the solder from spreading; and as the solder commonly did spread, so he believes the tinker's dam was as nearly worthless as the common expression of disesteem for it implies. He differentiates it from the common or garden dam, and says: "There is no profanity about it."

But not to care a tinker's dam is just as profane as not to care. A maverick dam, unbranded with ownership by tinkers or others. Taking the "out of damn does not take the curse off. If it is profane not to care a damn, it is just as profane to care a whiff, a jabberwock, a scow, or any other illegitimate and unnameable word. When one strenuously enunciates his refusal to appraise the article under discussion at the value of a damn, he is not swearing or cursing; he is using the language of the law. In the sense he means, there is no such noun as damn. We know what a tinker's dam is, but what is a damn? When one says he does not care a damn, he is far more profane than when he says he does not care a whoop. Whence arose the idea that not caring a damn was being profane, and why do persons who do not care one plume themselves on their devilisms?

It is not profane, but it has the sound of being profane, and that is all that is needed. An individual who would not for the world have his blameworthy language used to relieve his feelings by pronouncing the name of one of Wagner's operas in a tone that caused neighboring windows to fall in, and "contaminated" the atmosphere, never got such satisfaction as if he had violated a commandment. And who was the man who always swore by Charles G. D. Roberts' and Josephine Dodge Daeken because "they said so profane?" There is an excellent Methodist in this town who severely reprehends profanity whenever he hears it, but who produces all the effect of shocking blasphemy by the embittered emphasis he lays on the exclamation, "For God government's sake!!! Colonel Roosevelt plumes himself on his abstinence from profanity, but none of the unregenerate ever got such satisfaction out of real curse word as he does out of "By Godfrey!!!"

No, tinker's dam belongs in the comfort-giving galaxy of profanity for the emotions; and that is the worst you can say of the other damn.—New York Times.

TWENTY-FIVE DEAD RESULT OF STORM

Total is Over a Million—Public Service System All but Crisp.

Cincinnati, July 8.—With 25 known dead, ten missing and a property loss that will exceed \$1,000,000, Cincinnati tonight was making a valiant effort to recover from probably the worst storm in its history. Twelve of the dead were claimed by the Ohio river.

At 9:0 o'clock last night the storm broke; one-half hour later the city and its suburbs lay paralyzed. Its telephone system had been paralyzed; its citizens were groping in darkness, trying to ascertain the toll the storm had taken.

Two steamboats had gone down on the Ohio river; probably 100 houses were leveled; half a dozen church spires had fallen and when the full extent of the damage was ascertained last today, it was found that few houses had escaped damage.

Down town streets were strewn with electric signs and gises, while in the residence district and in the suburbs all traffic was blocked. Its trees blown across the thoroughfares.

Some 50 club houses along the Ohio river were swept into the stream and floated away. Tonight found the city with its street car service virtually normal. The telephone service is rapidly recovering and the city has done almost miraculous work in cleaning up the debris. Search for bodies in collapsed houses continues.

At terrace Park, a suburb, a special train carrying race horses from Latonia to the Eastern tracks was derailed. A river ride on the steamer Estelle. The boat was run ashore and tied, but it was not until today that the safety of the party was ascertained.

The Kentucky side of the river was hit as hard as was Cincinnati itself. Damage to Newport, Covington, Bellevue, Dayton, Fort Thomas, Fort Mitchell, Latonia and Ludlow. It is believed, almost, will equal damage done in this country.

McDon was made and carried that Wylie street be completed to the Seaboard depot with bituminous.

The contract for writing up the city tax books was awarded to Mr. M. C. Fudge, county auditor, compensation to be \$40.00.

The city clerk was instructed to check up the petitions for the bond collection, making a list of persons who have not yet signed such list to be turned over to the Aldermen who will endeavor together the required number of signatures.

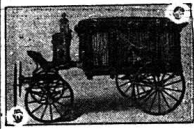

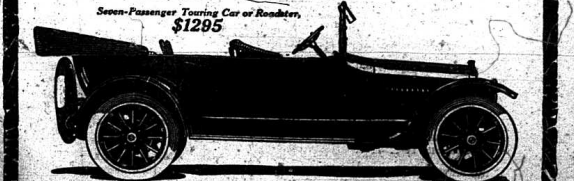
