From the Boston Courier. DR. LIBERTY'S NEW BOOK.

We regard the merits of this work as of a very high order. It is the latest and most complete and practical, original and richly stored with learning. It is not, in the words of a writer of a recent issue, "a mere compilation of facts, but a political philosophy." It contains nothing which will surprise the student of that studies; but it is more cheaply and finished in form and more generally accessible than any other work of the kind. The author does not write as a lawyer, but as a philosopher. He is a native of Germany, but speaks the language of the present country. He came to this country in 1837, having passed through the usual course of study in his native land. He has been twice imprisoned for political opinions, at least, in opinion of others. They may be summed up, perhaps, under these heads: republican federalism, strict construction of the State from the Constitution, equality and acknowledgment of natural rights in the citizen, and a more popular or scientific mode of the whole polity.

This follows the course which the true character of civil liberty is ingeniously shown by a reference to contrast, and by pointing out the defects and guarantee which depend from strict liberty. The author then devotes a chapter to the discussion of Gallian liberty, which, practically, is neither more nor less than the absolute rule of the majority. He then marks the difference between English and Gallian liberty by a single expression, as true as it is pointed out: the English system is in his general government, the Gallian system is not. He proceeds to a branch of his subject which is the various modifications and illustrations, occupying nearly the whole of the remaining portion of the work, that is, institutional self-government and institutional liberty. Liberty and self-government are to be obtained and perpetuated by means of the Constitution, the Gallian system is not.

In the appendix will be found an instructive paper on election statistics, another on the partitioning of power, and a third on judicial review and the protection of the rights of the citizen. He then discusses the Magna Charta, the Petition of Rights, the Bill of Rights, the Constitution of the United States, the present Constitution of France, &c. &c.
