Senate Kills Raylor Bill. The state senate last night by a decisive vote... The bill was passed by the house by a vote of 21 to 18, striking out the enacting words of the Senator Raylor's "purification" bill.

It is expected that a vote will be taken today on the Carey-Cotton bill and the friends of that measure are counting on at least two senators who supported the Raylor bill to vote with them on the local option measure.

It is also reported that Senator Townsend will be found in this column tomorrow than have the state dispensary act.

It can be safely asserted that no prohibition measure stands a ghost of a chance of being enacted.

The vote on the Raylor bill is said to have completely routed the dispensary forces, although several ardent friends of that measure are conferring to place bets next night that the Carey-Cotton bill will be defeated.
