September is National Preparedness Month

The Department of Homeland Security and the American Red Cross encourages you to prepare for disasters in your homes, businesses, schools and libraries. “Get a kit, make a plan, be informed and get involved.” <http://www.ready.gov/npm/index.htm>.

NOAA has raised the prediction of the 2005 Atlantic hurricane season outlook. The months of August through November are expected to have 11 -14 more named storms, 7-9 becoming hurricanes. This summer has already seen the most dramatic increase in named storms – July had 5 named storms, breaking the record for named storms during that month. This years’ Hurricane Season total expected Tropical Storms is 18-21 and is broken down in the following: 9-11 Tropical Storms will become Hurricanes, and 5-7 of those Hurricanes will be major Hurricanes. At present we have had 3 major Hurricanes – Dennis, Emily and Katrina.
