Charlotte Hill Men on Trial.

Greenboro, N. C., Feb. 28.—Before Judge Boyd in the United States district court here today the case of the government against the Charlotte Hill men was called for trial and five witnesses were examined today. The government seeks to prove \$100,000 in penalties for alleged violation of laws by the defendants in bringing into the United States certain alien unfortunates labor and offshoots to work in the cotton mills in and around Charlotte. The case now on trial is one in which 20 penalties are asked for and this will be used as a test case. In addition to this an original indictment for conspiracy has been found against them.

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PRESIDENTIAL SUCCESSION.

Plausible Inadequacy of the Present Law on the Subject Pointed Out.

Washington, February 13.—President's succession is the subject of an interesting report just submitted to the House representatives by Mr. Hardwick, of Georgia, on behalf of the committee on election of president, vice-president and representatives in Congress.

Examining law, the Act of January 19, 1866, provides that in case of removal, death, resignation or inability of both the president and vice-president, the secretary of state, the secretary of the treasury, the secretary of war, the attorney general, the postmaster general, the secretary of the navy and the secretary of the interior shall, in the order named, call the attention of the House to the disability of the president or vice-president.

"Your committee is not called upon to express any opinion as to the merits of the existing law. It may not, perhaps, be the best law that can be enacted by the Congress. However, it is the duty of the committee to report the law as it is, and to call attention to its inadequacy in certain respects."

"If a president-elect were to die before assuming office, would his vice-president-elect be president for the term? Again, if a president-elect and vice-president-elect should die prior to taking their offices, would the cabinet officers appointed by the outgoing president succeed in the order named in the present law when the new term begins? Suppose the democratic candidates for president and vice-president had been elected at the last election and had died before new cabinet officers had been confirmed, would the republican cabinet officers be in line of succession? There is no easy answer to any of these questions."

"The existing law provides that in case the succession shall devolve upon any of the persons named in the law, if Congress be not in session and would not meet within twenty days thereafter, then the person upon whom the duties of the office devolve shall by proclamation convene Congress in the next session, giving twenty days' notice of the time of the meeting."

"Neither was organized, and there was, therefore, no one to succeed to the duties of the presidency. Mr. Cleveland had died. The senate elected a republican, John Sherman, president pro tempore of that body, and he was, therefore, first in line of succession. The house elected a democrat, John C. Calhoun, speaker, and he then became first in line after Mr. Sherman."

Clean Food Recommended to Produce Best Results.

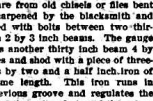
