





Va. signed an application for Mutual Beeciti navance on July 17, 1915, and paid the first quarterly premium of \$6.05 to the agent, taking in exchange therefor the Company's binding receipt. He made an appointment for examination the following day, but his wife. for whose benefit the l'aurance was to be taken, tried to dissuade him from adding to his insurance.

The agent, however, finally prevailed upon him to be examined and on July 23nd examination was made. It proved favorable in every respect. The application, which was for a Life Accelerative Endowment policy, \$1,000 at age 31, was received at the Home Office July 26th. In accordance with the Company's usual custom in such case, however, an inspect tion was called for which was received August 2nd. This being favorable, the application was approved by the Medical Board and passed on to the policy pariment. Folicy was issued and mail-ed on August 3, 1915.
