Mr. Editor:  
Your paper of week before last contains several editorial remarks in reference to the formation of a State Agricultural Society, and you say, "What say the people of our District, who say they are ready to do in aid of your Fishing Creek friends to the agricultural society at any time and place that may be agreed upon, and unite with them in forming a society, and aiding in every practicable way to promote the Agricultural Society."  
We have a flourishing Agricultural Society at work, and are ready either as a society or as individuals to give all the aid and assistance we can to the project. I think that there can be no difference of opinion as to the place of meeting, for the present at least. From its central position and convenience of access, it is naturally the place to which there may be some difference of opinion as to the proper time.

I would suggest either the month of September or October as the most favorable time to hold the object in view and concentrate public attention on this meeting, it ought to be held at a time most favorable for the exhibition of Agricultural products, fruits, &c. Agricultural fairs are usually held in the month of August to divide with public attention.

The object of such a meeting are of sufficient importance to require the attention of its best will attended without the collateral aid of the Legislative session or extra sessions and assemblies for other purposes. We have received from a friend who is on a visit to the Russian capital the subjoined account of proceedings there consequent upon the death of the late Emperor Nicholas. The burial took place on the 17th of March, 1855.

The streets were filled with people; still we were both disappointed in the demonstration of popular grief.
