Ordinance

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Chester in Council assembled, and by the authority of the same: That Section seventy-four (Sec. 74) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Chester be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 74. That it shall be unlawful for any person within the City of Chester to gamble or stake or wager any money or other thing of value upon any game, contest or competition, of chance, skill or strength, or to bet on any such game or contest, and it shall be further unlawful for any person within the City of Chester to play at any game with dice or cards in any wood, field or open place. Any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or by imprisonment not over thirty days.

Done and ratified in Council this March 7th, 1916.

2 EDISON BUILDINGS BURN.

Investor Plans Reconstruction While Firemen Are at Work

West Orange, N. J. March 20.—A fire that started from an explosion in one of the frame buildings of the Edison plant here destroyed two buildings last night and did damage estimated from \$2000 to \$20,000. Thomas Edison came from his home in Llewellyn Park as soon as the fire began and remained until the buildings and their contents had been destroyed. Then he announced that both structures would be replaced within six weeks.

The fire followed an explosion in a two and a half story frame building about 150 feet deep and 45 feet long in Alden Street, and used for the storage of materials, including cellulose.

By the time the fire fighters arrived the building was enveloped in flames. Another alarm brought the fire apparatus from Orange. Both companies made a courageous fight and succeeded in

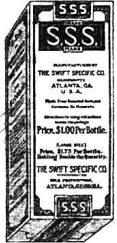
keeping the fire from spreading to the main plant across the street. The heat was intense. Windows were broken and the buildings on the opposite side scorched.

The second frame building was of the same size as the first and in it were kept ambered cylinder records and other record material. This building burned so rapidly as to do the first and the firemen had to confine most of their effort to saving the great plant.

No theory was expressed tonight as to the cause of the explosion. Mr. Edison did not discuss it; instead he gave his attention to the planning and reconstruction of the destroyed buildings.

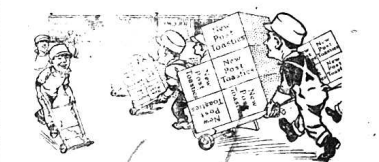
