Mr. Walter Moore, carrier of R. F. D. No. 6, was unexpectedly assaulted by "Bud" Thomas Saturday afternoon. Mr. Moore, Thomas and several others were standing in the lot to the rear of Dr. T. S. Leliner's store. Thomas was drunk and talking in an incoherent manner about a number of years ago.
Mr. Moore had previously had some work with him, and Mr. Moore reproved him for his language. Without any warning Thomas quickly whirled around and dealt Moore a telling blow on his forehead with a pair brass knuckles cutting a gash which required several stitches to sew up. Thomas immediately took leg bail, but was later captured and put in the lock up. He was to have had a hearing before the Mayor yesterday, but on account of the absence of some necessary witnesses the trial was put off until today. Thomas lived around here several years and was frequently in trouble, but for a while has made his home at Blackstock. Mr. Moore's wound was dressed by Dr. J. M. Hixie.

Doctor Took Wrong Medicine.
Tuesday afternoon Dr. J. M. Hunter went to his office to take some medicine for an attack of indigestion. He had several calls to make at once in his haste he picked up the wrong bottle and took as a dose of a very poisonous drug from which strychnine is made. After taking the medicine he went out and made several calls, when he returned he was very sick and had to have assistance to get upstairs to his office. Several physicians were summoned and the doctor who arrived in perfect condition was very critical condition, his limbs being almost perfectly stiff. It was only by resorting to heroic treatment and giving a number of strong antidotes that the effects of the poisonous drug were counteracted. The doctor finally came around alright and is now in a very narrow escape—Rock Hill Herald.
