These Whiskey Advertisements.

Since receiving the senator's courteous reply we have examined the advertising of the movement in the prohibition counties; as far as possible. The Greenville, News and the Anderson Mail, both dailies and circulating in dispensary as well as prohibition counties, have what some might call a "pretty good run" of whiskey advertisements. The News 14 inches out of 1,120 inches; the Mail 26 inches out of 960. The Mail seems particularly favored by whiskey houses, mostly because the Mail opposed the voting out of the dispensary in Anderson county. It is worthy of note that the Anderson Intelligencer, a large eight-page paper with the largest circulation of any weekly in the state, has not a whiskey advertisement; neither has the Greenville Mountaineer, a semi-weekly of large circulation. As for the State, that paper is published in a dispensary county. And it may be added that the Florence Times, a small daily, also published in a dispensary county, has whiskey advertisements also. We have looked through our files but can not find a copy of the Edgefield Chronicle; but of course take the senator's word that it is "cocked full" of whiskey advertisements. We have several copies of the Advertiser, published in the same county and it has not a line of whiskey advertisement. The Spartanburg Journal with 1,120 copies of space, has six inches of whiskey advertising; the Spartanburg Herald has none at all. So far as we can discover, there are no whiskey advertisements in the newspapers of Oconee or Pickens or Cherokee or Saluda or Union or York—or any of the remaining counties that have voted out the dispensary. So that it is neither just nor fair to charge that money is flowing into the coffers of these journals, "when only three or four out of twenty or more contain any whiskey advertisements at all."

What we object to in Senator Tillman's "Address to the People" is the sweeping and all-inclusive statement that "the coffers of these journals" that have helped to get rid of the dispensary are being filled "with the proceeds of whiskey advertisements, and the seeming inference that they are therefore in the pay of outside liquor houses—From the Newberry Observer.

The fight being waged by the mayor and police commission of Columbia against Sunday selling is to be commended. It means that the vending machines operated to sell cigars on Sunday are to be put out of business. The Daily Record of that city regrets with good reason the suppression of the machines. It says: "In the opinion of a number of influential business men the police commission in its strenuous zeal is pursuing a narrow policy which is about to break up an important business concern, which is trying to do a business throughout the state with Columbia as its headquarters." It is to be hoped that the movement in Columbia to put down Sunday selling is based upon higher grounds than the question of profit. "A narrow policy which is about to break up an important business concern" is one way to look at the question. This is the very marrow in most arguments for the selling of whiskey—it pays. But there are some people who seek to settle these questions upon higher grounds. It is the moral aspect that looms largest in their eyes. Besides, there are many of us who feel that to strive for the observance of the laws of God and of man is anything else than "narrow."—Union Times.

VENUSIUS AND VICINITY.

Conditions Much Enlarged—Fall of Volcanic Ashes Diminished.

Naples, April 11.—The whole of the Vesuvius district, as far as Naples, Caserta and Castellammare, is one vast Saharian desert. Reports tonight from all sides state that the fall of volcanic ash is not so heavy as it has been for the last few days and that the ashes are much finer, and from this it is argued that the prospects are somewhat brighter.

The blockade of local traffic continues, but service on the main lines of railway has been re-established, although greatly diminished by the insupportable confusion in the stations, where foreigners, not fully understanding the situation, inveigh against the delays and discomforts to which they have been subjected.

This has been a disgusting day in Naples. The people, alarmed by what has happened, have deserted their shops and the manufacturers are only nearly all closed. The crowds are a terror for any stranger. It would only require a spark to start a conflagration.

The arrival of King Victor Emmanuel and Queen Helena has done much to restore calm. They have been received with great joy, especially when the sovereigns left a hospital after a visit to the wounded there. One poor woman exclaimed: "I would consent to be wounded for the sake of being kissed by the Queen."

Others cannot find words in which to express their gratitude. Both the royal palaces of Capodimonte and San Fernando had been given up for good.

Naples, April 11.—Conditions tonight in the section affected by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius are greatly ameliorated. The fall of volcanic ashes has diminished and scientists express the opinion that the volcano has spent itself. All the papers tonight advise the public to be calm, pointing out the improved condition of affairs. The papers also eulogize Director Matteucci for his courage in returning to the ruined observatory on Mount Vesuvius and sending from that place messages of encouragement and expressions of confidence that Vesuvius will soon quiet down.

The theatres, cafes and other places of amusement throughout the city have been closed, and before all the sacred images in the streets candles are kept burning, while smaller images are being carried about, in many cases being set down in the open air surrounded by candles.

Troops are engaged in clearing the roofs of buildings of the accumulation of sand and ashes, which endangers the structural integrity of the city, which are much frequented, have been ordered closed, lest the weight upon the roofs should cause them to collapse.

The village of San Gennaro has been partly buried in sand and ashes, and several houses have fallen. At that place three persons were killed and four more than twenty injured.

In the road at Torre del Greco three persons were found dead from suffocation. The people who remain at Torre Annunziata are in danger of perishing from starvation. All the shops having been closed. Ratons for 200 persons have been sent there.

The war ships ordered here have been doing effective service in the removal of refugees. Premier Sonnino reached here today by train from Rome, his journey having been greatly impeded. He had a conference immediately after his arrival with King Victor Emmanuel, with whom the premier discussed the measures to be adopted to restore public confidence, maintain order, aid the refugees and repair the damage caused by the eruption.
