Speaking of his own bill, Mr. Nash said there were certain features of it, notably that which places the sale of whiskey in the hands of the druggists under restrictions that insure the most strictly for medicinal and mechanical uses, which were not altogether satisfactory to him. He pointed out that the bill would be amended, and so far as he was concerned, he thought if such a law could be passed it would be well to outline it altogether. As a means of meeting the interstate commerce law and preventing whiskey being shipped in for illicit trade, he favored a law which would require all whiskey coming into the state to be consumed within 100 feet of the point of delivery.

'Profit by By-Products.'

What is meant by the phrase 'profit by-products?' The answer is simple. Coal is not burned up when gas is extracted, but it comes from the furnace as by-products. One of these is the by-product of iron making. Coal gas is another. Formerly what are now called by-products were waste. Now they are a source of profit. By a method which utilizes everything in the slag-house it is said the Chicago packers can sell the most products for less than they pay for cattle and get rich. The hides and tallow, the bristles, the bones, every particle of the blood and bone is used and value is saved and paid for contribution to the income.

Apply the same principle to the farm. Formerly cotton seed was waste; today it is an important part of the crop. In time the cotton plant will be able to stir the seed of every particle of trash when the seed will be more valuable. In time the stalks will be valuable. Consider the use of the seed for it. It is not a broader view. The waste places: the fence corners; the wet places; the barren places. Make the best use of the soil. Make the blossoms and the flowers give up their bounty. The orchard, if you are a cotton planter or grass raiser, should be made to contribute to the income. The hen is a great enemy to insects. Have hens, but do not neglect them. Have hogs to consume the waste of the year. They are a good money-maker. To get the best results select the best seed. Discard the poor. Plant the best. Use the best. Buy the best. In small groves or in out-of-the-way places. Plant grapes, such as sheep.
