An Ordinance

An Ordinance To Provide For The Improvement Of Columbia Street And To Levy An Assessment For One-Half The Cost Of Improvements Upon The Owners Of Abutting Property.

Whereas, a petition signed by a majority of the owners of property abutting on the east side of Columbia street from Main street to Hinton street, and thence on the west side of Columbia street to and including the property of S. E. Wylie, and praying for the construction of a cement sidewalk on said sides of said street between said points, under the Act of 1916, Chapter 114, with the clerk of this council.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the city of Chester, in council assembled, and by the authority of the same, that a cement sidewalk be hereby ordered to be constructed on the east side of Columbia street, from Main street to Hinton street, and on the west side of Columbia street, from Hinton street to and including the premises of S. E. Wylie, according to the specifications of city engineer, and not exceeding ninety cents per square yard.

Provided, that before entering any amount in said book, said clerk shall publish notice that said work is to be done on the day specified in the notice, and that any objections to the proposed assessment roll, which shall then be entered in said book, shall be presented to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, on or before the day specified in the notice.

An Ordinance To Provide For The Improvement Of Columbia Street And To Levy An Assessment For One-Half The Cost Of Improvements Upon The Owners Of Abutting Property.

Whereas, a petition signed by a majority of the owners of property abutting on the east side of Columbia street from Main street to Hinton street, and thence on the west side of Columbia street to and including the property of S. E. Wylie, and praying for the construction of a cement sidewalk on said sides of said street between said points, under the Act of 1916, Chapter 114, with the clerk of this council.
