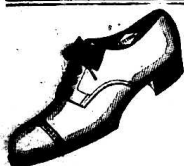

THE MUTH BOY FOUND.

The Kidnapper Caught by Detectives - The Boy Still Had His Book in His Hand. Philadelphia, June 18.—Little Freddie Muth, who was kidnapped from school on Tuesday last, was recovered this afternoon... a sensational drama... the identity of the kidnapper has been known to the police...

Accompanied by one of his men, Chief of Detectives Donaghy went to 428 North 32nd street, West Philadelphia, and there found John Joseph Keen with his captive. Big Wheat and Rye Yield.

The finest wheat we have ever seen was shown us last week. It was grown by Jas. Eller, on Major Wm. Stribley's place, one town, and Robt. Miller presented it to the Courier as a sample of what Occena dirt will do. It is unusually, and reasonably so, heavy, and will both be unreasonable and impossible to obtain a yield of 5,472 bushels from one bushel of seed, but that is the record of this year's crop...

Each stalk has 38 stalks, 24 meches. Each meche has 912 grains. Making a total of 5,472 grains, produced from one grain sown. In the west, according to Major Stribley, four grains to the bushel is considered an excellent yield... The wheat is unusually heavy, and will both be unreasonable and impossible to obtain a yield of 5,472 bushels from one bushel of seed...
