

AMERICANS NEARLY
ALL OUT OF MEXICO

Than 1,600 Refugees Now of the United States.

Washington, Jüne 29.—Virtually all Americans except those who have refused to leave are out of Mexico Despatches today to the State and War Departments reported the departure of more than 1,700 refugees. About 1,000 Americans from Tampico and Vera Crus are to arrive at Gaiveston tomorrow on the tender Dixie and the oil ahip Wylie. More than 400 are quartered at Vera Crus on the battleship Nebraska, sevenfeen men, fifteen women and fifteen chain deep the seven to today. All of these will be brought North by the transport Hancock, which also

All of these will be brought North by the transport Hancock, which also will pick up fourteen from the gunboat Wheeling at Carmen, and additional refugees at Tampico.

On the west coast 209 Americans are on the cruiser Cleveland and the supply ship flacier. They will go to San Diego, Cal. There are sixty-seven on the cruiser Colorado at Manzanillo.
