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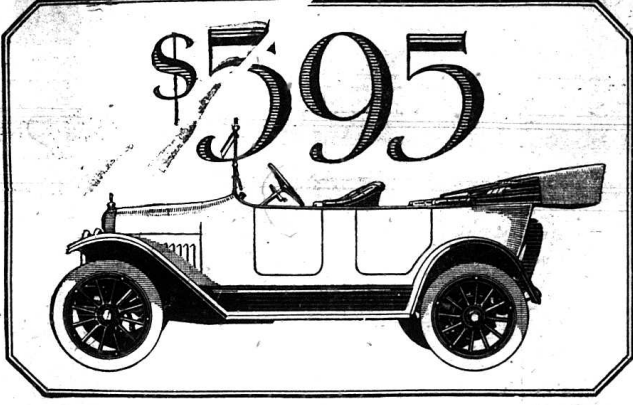

AMERICANS NEARLY ALL OUT OF MEXICO

More Than 1,600 Refugees Now on Their Way Back to the United States.

Washington, June 29.—Virtually all Americans except those who have refused to leave are out of Mexico. Dispatches today to the State and War Departments reported the departure of more than 1,700 refugees.

About 1,000 Americans from Tampico and Vera Cruz are to arrive at Galveston tomorrow on the steamer Dixie and the oil ship Wylie. More than 400 are quartered at Vera Cruz on the battleship Nebraska, seventeen men, fifteen women and fifteen children having been taken on today. All of these will be brought North by the transport Hancock, which also will pick up fourteen from the gunboat Wheeling at Carmen, and additional refugees at Tampico.

On the west coast 209 Americans are on the cruiser Cleveland and the supply ship Glacier. They will go to San Diego, Cal. There are sixty-seven on the cruiser Colorado at Manzanillo.

All Americans except three have left the Yaqui Valley region, according to official reports.
