Warm Springs, Ga., July 17—District Attorney Jerome delivered an address on "Public Opinion," Its power, some of las wils and Injustices and "our duty as tawyers to ft," begreated the consight. In the course of his address, Mr., Jerome referred, to, President, Roosevelt's criticism of a United States court judge, saying.
