Chase After Runaway Engine.

Greenville, Aug. 5.—Flagman Robert Grist, of the yard force of the Southern railway, had an exciting chase yesterday after a runaway engine.

The northbound last mail had just gone through and yard engine No. 13 was occupying a siding near the depot with the cab unoccupied. All the yard men were at breakfast, and as is the usual custom, the little shifter was fired ready for use when needed.

The fires were burning steadily and in a short time sufficient steam was generated to put the cylinder rods in motion. Pulling vigorously, No. 13 cleared the sidings and crossed the frog to the main line, starting in the direction of Spartanburg at a rapid rate with no one at the throttle.

The crew of shifting engine No. 73, seeing No. 13 on a wild run, realized the danger of a collision with a through train about due and jumped into the cab of No. 73 with the purpose of overhauling the runaway before the accident could happen.

Near Paris station, about two miles from the city, the pursuers on No. 73 bumped into No. 13, breaking the coupling.

Flagman Robert Grist, at this critical time, recognized that something had to be done and at considerable risk jumped from the front of his engine to the tender of the runaway, clambered over the coal, and on reaching the cab gripped the throttle and shut off the steam.

No. 73 reversed and brought the runaway back to the yards.—Special to The State.

**Campaign Dead-Beats.**  
 A meeting of the various candidates was held yesterday and the agreement was entered upon that all of them would confine the expenses of their campaign strictly to legitimate purposes, and grafters were formally notified that there would be nothing in it for them this time.

In taking this stand Richard county and her candidates have set an example worthy of all emulation throughout the state. Primary elections have become so costly that it is almost impossible for any one to stand for office unless he has a good bank balance; but that is a small matter in comparison with the evil effects of bribery and corruption in elections have upon public morals, and when any decided stand is taken against such practices the widest attention should be given to it in order that the same spirit may spread and rule throughout the state.  
 In Richard, owing to the demands of grafters and the custom to yield to them, the expenses of the candidates were away beyond what they ought legitimately to have been called upon to pay. This, of course, meant bribery, but such a harsh term was not generally used, or thought of, by candidates in many instances, yet that is what these expenses of a campaign really meant. The same conditions have prevailed and do yet in other parts of the state to a greater or less extent. Richard's example is, therefore, not only a cheering sign of a revival of an honest, healthy public sentiment; but it is one that will encourage others to do likewise.—Columbia Record.

 The Camden People is indignant because a prisoner was carried from Camden to the penitentiary "for safe keeping." It says there was no danger of lynching, and if there had been the jailer, sheriff and chief of police could have successfully defended the strong jail. The People thinks it a reproach to the county to acknowledge that a prisoner cannot be protected and the law enforced. We have said the same thing and agree with the Camden paper. It seems to us that the sheriff who runs from the lawless gang of men, real or imagined, should consider the propriety of tendering his resignation, just as a sheriff who loses a prisoner, or whose deputies lose a prisoner, at the hands of a mob, should be relieved of his official duties—and the legislature should so provide. There is nothing so like a big, double-jointed bully as the average mob. Run from it and it will pour you valiantly; face it with courage and it will sink away like the coward that it is, even if its strength be overwhelmingly superior. The officer flees from a mob and so fail in their duty, the more mobs there will be to flee from. Would a sheriff run from two men, or three men? No, he could warn them, and if they persisted in attempting to take the prisoner he could shoot to kill. Then why should he be considered as more afraid of the persons in a mob of 10 or 100? Is it cowardice on the part of the officials? Do they fear for their lives, or do they fear losing jobs in the primaries? What is the matter?—The State.
