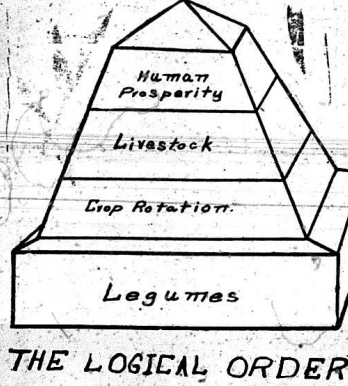

ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the city of Chester, in council assembled and by the authority of the same:

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct or carry on within the city of Chester any auction sale of horses or mules, either by public or private first secured a license for such business.

Such license shall be good for one year and shall be issued by the city clerk upon the payment to him of the sum of two hundred dollars and an additional sum of ten dollars for each animal sold or produced to be sold in excess of twenty.

Any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or by imprisonment not for thirty days, and each sale or offering for sale of any horse or mule shall constitute an offense.

Done and ratified in council this 8th day of September, 1916. Z. V. DAVIDSON, Mayor.

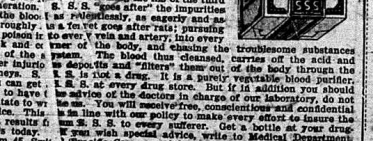
