The Amendments.
We have no great zeal on the question of biennial sessions, but in the absence of any very substantial objections, we see no good reasons why the amendment should not be adopted, as it would probably save to the state anywhere from \$25,000 to \$50,000 in the off years. The length of session for which members can draw pay will still be limited to 40 days, and as we pay for that number of days in annual sessions, it appears as if we should save the whole cost of a session every other year, and we believe this amounts to about \$50,000.

It has been asserted by opponents of the amendment that the extra sessions that would be necessary would consume most of the amount saved, but there is very little argument to support this. The change would not take effect until 1907 and this would give time to provide for an interval of two years. If adjustment to the change should make an extra session necessary, it need not be necessary afterward in ordinary circumstances. Besides, extra sessions would need to be only for a special purpose and very short, and hence not so expensive as the regular sessions, when much time is spent with routine matters and a good deal more is spent in a kind of aimless desultory way. Indeed it is only when the forty-day limit is soon approaching that session is directed earnestly to definite work. This would not be the case when a definite object was presented at the start.

The objection that our laws are all made with a view to annual sessions presents only a temporary difficulty, and there are very few matters in which any continuation would be essential. Very few of the states have annual sessions and we have heard of but a single state in which there has been a desire to go back to annual sessions after trying biennial sessions. Of course all these other states encountered the same obstacles in making the change that would present themselves to us, and they got over them satisfactorily.

A consideration which may appear to some rather trifling we believe nevertheless has real weight. With fewer sessions of the law-making body there would be fewer laws to repeal, and with longer intervals our laws would gain respect as having more permanency.

We believe there would be decided gain and little if any loss by adopting this amendment, therefore let us vote "yes."

The constitutional amendment relating to special legislation on the matter of working public roads seems to be a necessary, and we believe there is no objection to it.

The amendment relating to municipal bonded indebtedness concerns only the city of Greenville, and few people will trouble themselves to object.

So we can safely vote "yes" on each of the amendments.

Don't fail to vote next Tuesday, at least for congressman and biennial sessions.

Every man who voted at the primary should vote at the general election next Tuesday. Put yourself to a little trouble, if necessary, to help make your vote appear in the true light. We are disappointed and discredited abroad on account our small vote in the general election.

The other departments of this mill are running regularly and everything seems to move along nicely. The health of our place is good. Crops in this vicinity are fine. Mr. Wilson, from Lancaster, delivered a lecture on the Junior Order and organized a lodge of 20 members. Mr. Larkenson delivered a lecture on the Woodmen of the World.

A costly number of our people attended the circus Monday at Chester. They all returned alive with whole bones and reported a good time. They were favorably impressed with the city, what they saw of it. They could not see the town for the people.

The greater portion of the fleece staple in this vicinity is gathered and many farmers are building barns to house their large crop of corn, peas, forage etc. The crop is the best for many years and prices are good. I guess a lot of people will go to farming next year that never farmed before, at least that is the talk in this community. We will see.

The Fruit vs. Fruitless Farm.

In a point of economy the farmer who raises his own fruit has everything his own way over the one who does not, for the cost of production is very small, while the outlay or first cost is insignificant. The raising of a family supply of fruit interferes very little with other farm work and the growing of fruit for market on a side line is very profitable, for while the cost of production is small, the fruit comes high very often to those who have to buy; hence this advantage of the fruit farm. Aside from saving, there is a great advantage in having fruit fresh and crisp from the tree or vine, which the farmer of the fruitless farm cannot enjoy.

How much more pleasing and appetizing is fresh whole fruit than that which is wilted and meshed with little of the original flavor left. The table of the man who grows his own fruit is well provided with fruit of a quality which the less provident cannot have. The man who raises his own fruit uses it more lavishly than the one who has everything to buy; hence, the better living and the more advantage of the medicinal value of fruit. The orchard, too, is a drawing card to the majority of home seekers; consequently, the farm is more valuable and often quicker sold when it has an interesting fruit supply on it. Some kind of fruit is adapted to every section of the country. If the peach, pear or plum is not adapted, the apple is very likely, and by a succession can be made to take the place of other fruit.—E. W. Jones, in The Epitomist.

Plowing Made Easier.

Labor can be saved in plowing and the work done well by properly laying out the plow. A square acre plowed with a 6 ft. and 11 ft. furrow, requires 94 rounds and 336 turns. The same acre, in the form of a parallelogram—2 by 80 rods—requires only 13 rounds and 52 turns, but requiring much less time to do the work. The same rule applies to cultivation. The longer the rows the less time required, as there will be fewer turns at the ends of the rows. It is the turning of the plow or cultivator which causes loss of time, to say nothing of the extra work imposed on the man who is plowing or cultivating.—E. W. Jones, in The Epitomist.

How We Catch a Cold.

M. Humphreys, in the Epitomist.

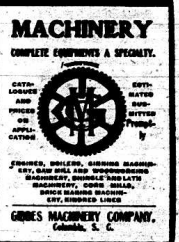
