Some of the secular papers have found a mare's nest in the action of Synod concerning the use of tobacco. Some one who did not know the truth or who considers truth uninteresting gave a false version of the matter, and from all sides we hear of legislation, prohibition and discipline to follow; and more than all of the earnestness enticed. Synod did not legislate. No order was passed; no prohibition was made; no discipline is to follow. Bishops were not included. The writer of this voted against the action taken, but it was proper action. Synods may express their mind concerning the cigarette, and concerning the tobacco habit, which by common observation and consent is more or less filthy and unwholesome. They may prohibit their servants in high position to have a care for their example. And this is what the Synod did. The resolution, which we quote as originally offered, speaks for itself.

"That the patrons of the college may reasonably expect the president and faculty to assume such a position regard to the use of tobacco, especially the cigarette, as will enable them to say to the students: 'These things which we have both learned and received and heard and seen in us, are do.'"

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#### Death from Antitoxin.

Laurens, Dec. 2.—Today at noon the whole city was startled by the announcement of the sudden death of Mr. William Perce, Caline at his home on South Harper street. Mr. Caline's death was due to the effects of antitoxin administered by his physician. Mr. Caline had a child very sick with diphtheria and on yesterday 3,000 units of antitoxin were given the patient. Today Mr. and Mrs. Caline were given a prophylactic dose of 1,000 units each. That administered Mr. Caline brought on a convulsion immediately and he expired within a short time. Such effects from antitoxin are rare. The deceased was the eldest son of the late Dr. E. M. Caline and was a young man of social and business prominence, being cashier of the Bank of Laurens and interested in other business. He was a Presbyterian and a Shiner Mason. Several years ago he was married to Miss Virginia Moorhead, who, with two children, surviving. He is also survived by his mother, Mrs. Rosa I. Caline, and several brothers and sisters, in addition to a large and prominent family connection, including the Kirby family. The funeral service will probably be held tomorrow afternoon.—Special to The State.

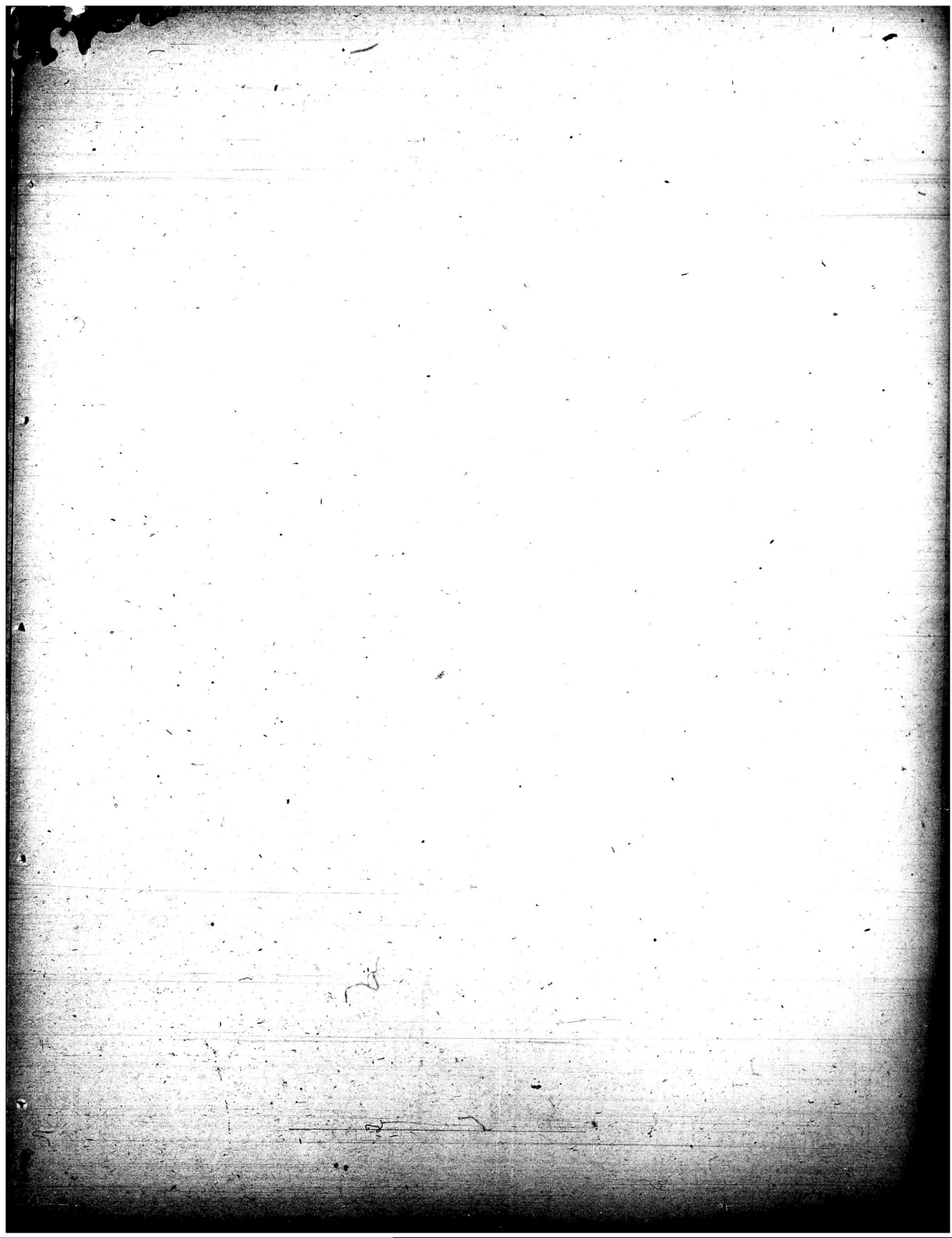
