"Not Guilty" Verdict in Trial of Men Charged With Murder of Nurse
New York, Nov. 25.—The trial of the men charged with the murder of a nurse in the hospital here on the night of August 21, 1917, was closed today with a verdict of "not guilty" for all the defendants.

TAX RETURN NOTICE FOR 1918.

In accordance with the law, tax books for the return of all real and personal property for the year 1918 will be open on Tuesday, Nov. 19, 1918, and will be closed on Friday, Nov. 29, 1918, after which the fifty per cent penalty will be attached to all delinquents. All real estate to be returned, 1918 being real estate year.

Sec. 1, Art. 323, of the General Assembly of South Carolina, provides as follows: "It shall be the duty of all persons to make returns of all personal property and real estate owned by them, and to return the same to the collector of the county, to be at the following points on the dates assigned, after which it will be a misdemeanor to refuse to take returns."
