Scope and Content Note: This collection contains correspondence, titles, and leases concerning James S. White Jr. and McCrory's Dime Store, as well as, blueprints, newspaper clippings, and a McCrory's Store inventory. McCrory's Dime Store was located on Main Street in Rock Hill, South Carolina in a building built in 1901. McCrory's operated from 1937 through 1997 and from 1960-1961 was the site of several "sit-in" protests by black students from nearby Friendship Jr. College. On January 31, 1961, the famous "sit-in" by the "Friendship Nine" was held at McCrory's lunch counter. They protesters refused to pay their fines and became the first protesters in the nation to adopt the "Jail No Bail" strategy of protest.
