#### BIOGRAPHICAL

Mrs. W. E. Cochran (Bernace "Bee" M. Cochran) (1908-2002) married W. Edward Cochran (1889-1973); they were from Greenville County, South Carolina. She had a huge involvement in the South Carolina Extension Homemakers Council and branched off from that into the Council of Farm Women, and the Home Demonstration Club. While involved in the Extension Homemakers Council she wrote a book titled, <u>History of</u> <u>South Carolina Extension Homemakers Council: Fifty Years 1921-1971</u>.

- <u>1908</u> Bernace was born on August 10, 1908.
- <u>1959</u> She started her involvement in the South Carolina Extension Homemakers Council and she became Publicity Chair from 1959 to 1962.
- <u>1962</u> She became the Piedmont District Director from 1962 until 1964.
- <u>1965</u> Mrs. W. E. Cochran from Greenville County was elected State Council President in 1965 and continued her term until 1968.
- 1968 She became a Member At Large from 1968 to 1970.
- 1969 She was elected and served as Secretary for the Country Women's Council from 1969 to 1971.
- <u>1971</u> Mrs. Bee Cochran wrote a pageant about the highlights of the first 50 years of the Council and presented it at the state meeting in 1971.
- <u>1973</u> Mrs. Cochran was nominated for Southern Region Director for the National Extension Homemakers Council in 1973, she did not get it.
- <u>1973</u> She became the State Family and Community Education Historian from 1973 to 1997.
- <u>1986</u> Mrs. Cochran attended the Triennial Meeting of the Associated Country Women of the World in May, 1986 in Killarney, Ireland.
- <u>2002</u> Mrs. W. E. Cochran died on August 17, 2002.
