armed services, return to spend his last year in our school. In the election of Miss Emmett Scott, Dorothy Stinson was chosen by an

overwhelming majority to be our representative in the 1951 Christmas Parade. Our class is also honored with Lugenia Rowells, president of the State Health Association. Lugenia Rowells along with Larlee Stewart and a member of the Junior class headed the Christmas Seal Sale in our school.

During our four years in high school we had our share of class members on

the band as majorettes, flag bearers, and musicians.

Now we are about to graduate. We were happy to serve in all capacities in which we found opportunities. Our stay was a pleasant one and we hope that it will be a challenge to those who might find it profitable to follow in our footsteps.
