


Foreword

HISTORY OF THE BAND

It happened in June, 1941. The Emmett Scott High School Band was organized by Mr. Frontis Brooks. The first instrument purchased was a clarinet by Christopher Lindsay, the second, a trombone by Willie Howard Simpson, and the third, a mellophone by James Cassell. Those of you who know instrumentation would say, "what a combination!" Later Harry Lee Dixon joined the group with a trumpet.

The administration saw that band business was definitely on their minds, so they contributed a bass drum and field drum which are still used in the school system today.

By September the entire city had caught band fever and more than fifty parents purchased instruments for their children.

The members practiced daily during the last class period in the school day. This was the eighth period instead of the sixth because of crowded conditions that existed at Emmett Scott.

On December 7, 1941 Pearl Harbor was attacked by Japan. This incident dampened the spirit on instrumental music for Rock Hillians since the Bandmaster was eligible for the services.

In March 1942, the band was invited to perform at the Palmetto State Teachers Association in Columbia, South Carolina. That was a horrible trip. One of the buses broke down which necessitated walking a fourth of the way. The school board had just purchased 41 coats and a drum major shako. The band made the trip to Columbia without hats; the girls wore white skirts and the boys wore white trousers which were purchased by their parents. They were not very white on arriving in Columbia.

In July 1942, Mr. Brooks was inducted into the army. The band was at a stand-still until 1946 when he returned. During his absence many of the students had practiced by themselves and grew proficient on their respective instruments. Those of special note were Bobby Plair and William Henry Massey, who are currently bandmasters.

From 1946 to 1951, the band did general routine work such as performing for football games, parades, and special civic events.

In 1952 the band distinguished itself by appearing in the parade staged by the centennial committee commemorating Rock Hill's one hundredth birthday celebration. During the same year, Mr. Brooks was selected as the most outstanding "man of the year" by the Lit Phy Civic and Social Club of Rock Hill.

In 1953 the Elk's State Convention was held in Rock Hill. It selected Emmett Scott High School Band to represent South Carolina bands in its national convention in Atlanta, Georgia. The following year the band represented South Carolina bands in Chicago, Illinois at the national convention.

Former presidents of the aggregation were Green Edward Williams, Jack L. Blake, Clifton Ivey, Frank Berry, Jr., Roosevelt Barnette, and Melvin Neely. Drum majors have been James Russell Williams, Doreatha Harris, Charles B. Ferguson, Elaine Lowery, Harry Ellis, Pheodus Robinson, and Nancy Dixon. One of the first majorettes, Miss Betty A. Crockett, is presently the majorette trainer.

During the past year there were 132 students enrolled in instrumental music at Emmett Scott. One hundred and eleven of those students were members of the marching band.





1955-59

EPOCH I

Excelling in varsity sports were such outstanding seniors as Juanita Roach, Jr., Melvin Neely, Robert Kennedy, Samuel Mack, Jr., James T. Barber and Rosa Ann Cauthen.

Laudation came once again as sponsor of the student amateur talent hunt. Paul McFadden was at his best as Master of Ceremonies with gay and petite Wilma Foster nobly assisting him.

Two of our most important projects were: production of a yearbook, and preparation for "The Glass Mountain", our class play. Under the inspiring leadership of Catherine Moore and capable staff, the former objective was successfully completed. The carefully selected cast: Marie McFadden, Daisy Stroud, Melvin Barnette, Constance Boyd, Josephine Anderson, James Massey, William Dunlap, Elizabeth Carter, and Elizabeth Miller did not fail us in the latter objective.




