ROCK HILL, S.C. — An exhibit at the Museum of York County has inspired a new showcase for Winthrop University students.

"The Art & Science of Illustration," opening Jan. 25 at the museum, features imaginative renderings students created in Associate Professor David Brown's comparative anatomy illustration course. There will be an opening reception on Jan. 23 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at the museum. It is free and open to the public.

The students studied animals and human anatomy at the museum's Naturalist Center and took what they observed to the drawing board—literally.
