Noting that everyone is affected by the quality of education, J. B. Law, Chairman, said parents want schools to provide students with an education that will allow them to function with



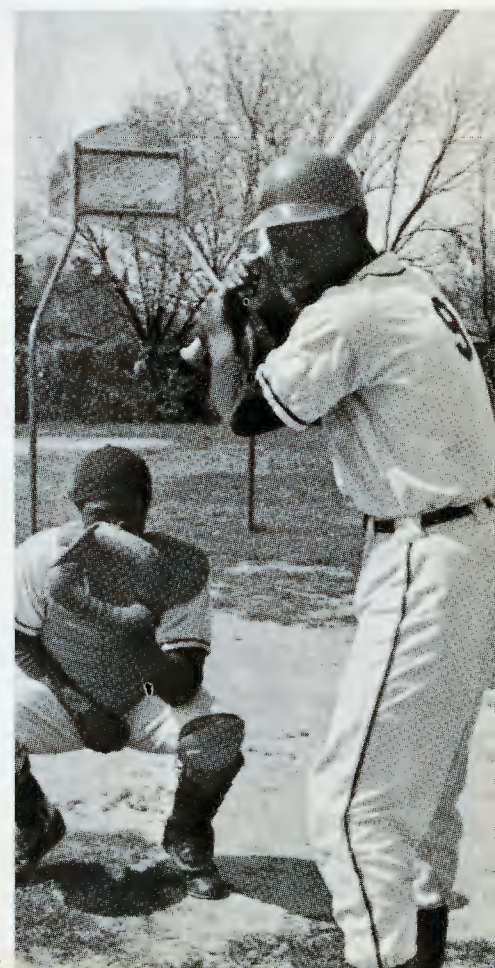

 fored us.

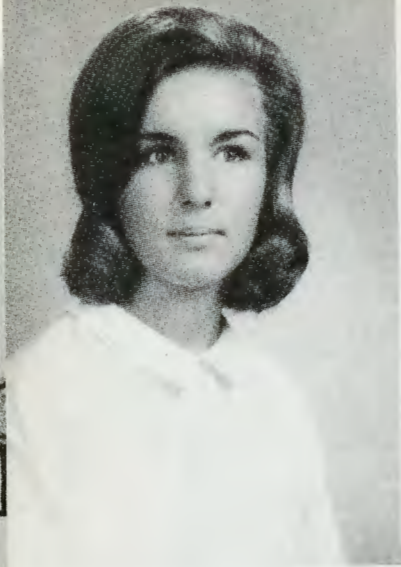

Larry Hart gunned 19 points to lead the Rattlers to a 64-43 win over the Roosevelt Tigers in the opening game of the season here. Hart led the Rattlers on a torrid first quarter scoring binge, collecting 10 points on five field goals and also added a free throw for a total of 11 points. Big Fred Smith, Emmett Scott center took command of the backboards, pulling down 19 rebounds to lead in that department, and also took runnerup scoring honors with 17.

The Rattlers took the lead the first time they had the ball, and never relinquished it, with the exception of a 4-4 tie early in the game.

Emmett Scott's pressing defense blunted the Roosevelt offensive thrust, with the exception of William Dulin who took game scoring honors with 23 points.

Dulin, a rangy 6-5 center, kept the Tigers within striking distance of Emmett

Scott throughout the game. Most of his 23 points came on tapins and short layups.

After tak'tg a six point lead at the end of the first quarter, Emmett Scott blew to a 33-18 halftime lead, while Roosevelt found itself mired in a scoring famine.

Dulin's field goal and foul shot were the only points scored by Roosevelt in the second period, while Emmett Scott collected 12 points. Roosevelt made a strong bid to come back in the third period, but Emmett Scott rebounded from a four minute scoring drought to keep the Tigers at a six point disadvantage.

The Rattlers held a 47-34 lead at the end of the three stops, but ballooned that to point lead (54-34) with five minutes left in the game. The Rattler coaches inserted reserves into the lineup with two left to finish the game.

When Bowman was successfully covered, the Rattlers go balanced scoring from Fred Smith who hooped 29 points, and also Larry Hart and Terry Thompson who got 24 and 20 points each.

C. A. Johnson got its scoring from three men, with Ronnie Taylor scoring 24 points to lead the attack.

Ricky Barber, Emmett's guard failed to score a point, but got 17 assists.

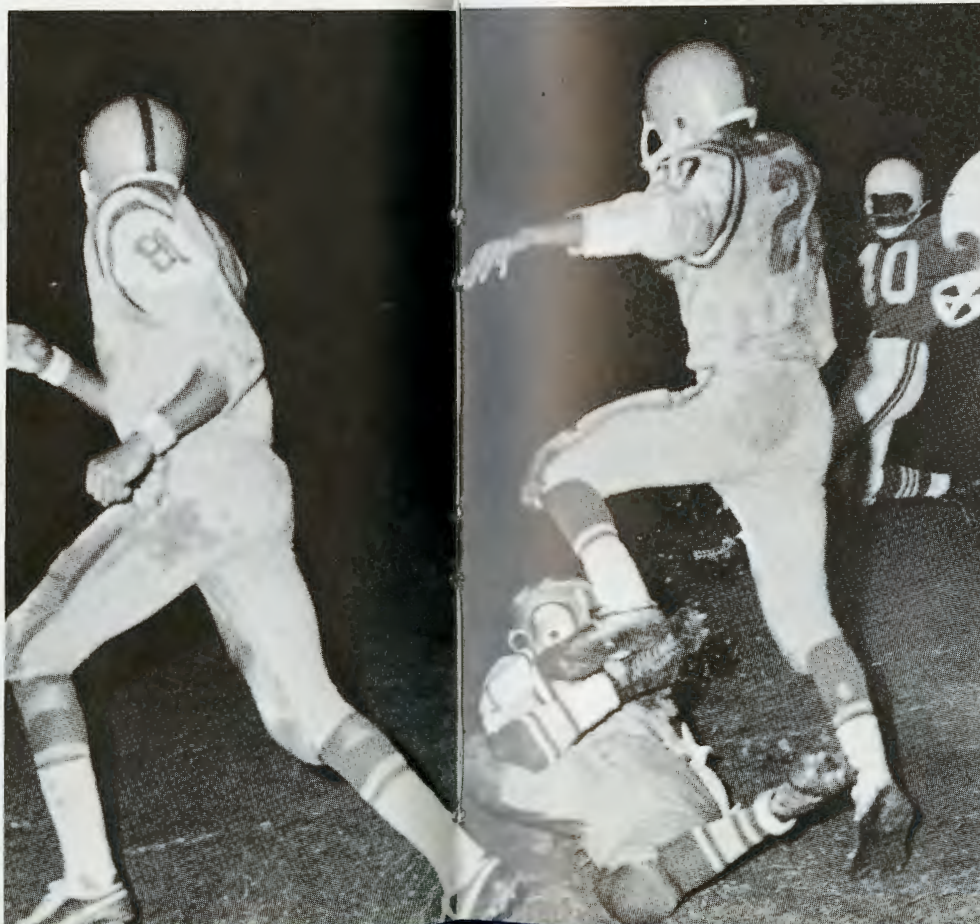
Emmett Scott's run and gun offense smashed a stubborn C. A. Johnson outfit to the tune of 105-78 and gave the Rattlers their fifth straight win of the year.

Unleashing a devastating offensive effort, the Rattlers rolled up a nine point lead in the first quarter and never were in trouble after that.

Albert Bowman, improving with each game, rattled the backboards for 21 rebounds and scored 32 points to head the Emmett Scott attack.

It was the first conference game of the year for the Rattlers and C.A. Johnson was reported to have one of the stronger teams in the conference.
