Now, however, we have seen taxation grow so large under representative government as to affect the stake in the land which every citi-zen would have if he could. Taxation has reach-ed a point which makes difficult if not impossible small ownership where it has not yet been attain-ed, and discourages if where it has. Any system that taxes citizens out of ownership into tenancy, that makes it easy to rent one's place in the na-tion and hard to own it under the security of law, is a bad system, and undermines the nation more than any destructive political teaching could. The homes of a people are the country's strength, not its tenements. This view of taxation merits attention.-Selected.




