Constantinople, April 27.—The reign of Abdul Hamid II, ended 'oday with bis_discostion and the accession of his_brother, Mehemed Reschaad Effendi as Mehmend V., a variation of "Mahmed," it being coraldered in-appropriate to assume the precidence in the thirty fifth sovereign of Turkey, in male descent, of the House of O-man, the founder of the empire, and is the twenty nitoth suitan since the conjust of Constantinoples.


