### WARRANTS ISSUED.

For Joe Land and Edgar Chalk Charged With Violating the Fish Laws.

It will be recalled that a few days ago mention was made of the fact that several parties whom Game Warden White had prosecuted near Neal's for violation of the fish laws had been released by Magistrate Wise when the cases came to trial.

When the state auditors society heard of the matter they were very much vexed and as a result Mr. James Henry Rice, the secretary of the society, arrived in the city on Wednesday afternoon and went into consultation with game warden White and several of the authorities. As a result of the conference warrants were issued by Judge J. J. McLure for the arrest of Edgar Chalk and Joe Land on the charge of violating the fish laws. The warrants were sworn out by Mr. J. J. McLure and will likely be held in a few days.

Mr. A. L. Gaston has been employed by the society to prosecute the offenders and the trial will likely attract a good deal of interest. The following is the section under which the warrants were sworn out:

"And there shall be a close time in all persons engaged in the inland waters of the State, from the setting of the sun each Thursday until the rising of the sun on each Monday, during which time it shall be unlawful to use any net, trap, or any plan or device for the stoppage or collection of fish which obstructs any portion of the creek, stream or inland water, and upon conviction thereof any such net, trap or device shall be liable to be impounded for a period of not less than three or more than six months, or both, in the discretion of the court trying the case and the offender shall be liable to apply to fishing with dip nets used by hand."
