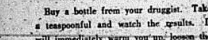

Macon Woman Found Murdered on Highway. Macon, Ga., May 10.—With six lacerations in her left arm and six similar wounds in her neck, the body of Mrs. W. M. Bairman, 69, widow of a former assistant editor of the Macon Telegraph, was found near a well traveled country road, three and a half miles from Macon, this morning.

A coroner's jury investigating the case this afternoon held that it was the murder of Sheriff Hicks believes that she was slain by a negro. The entire sheriff's force of deputies is at work on the case.

An ORDINANCE. An Ordinance to Provide for the Improvement of Certain Streets of the City of Chester, S. C.

That the following named streets, or parts of streets, are hereby ordered to be improved and paved according to plans and specifications of the engineers employed by the City: York street, from Main street to the Seaboard Air Line Railway; Valley street, from Main street to Church street; Columbia street, from Main street to the Seaboard Air Line Railway; and

That the City Engineer shall prepare an accurate roll of the amount of assessments for each property, and the City Clerk shall enter same in a book to be kept by him called the 'ASSESSMENT BOOK'.

That the amount of assessments hereby levied upon said property owners, respectively, and is payable within ten days after the completion of said work, and the Clerk shall collect legal interest upon all amounts collected after the same are past due.

CONFEDERATE HERO, TO ELECTROCUTED WHEN HE MEETS LIVE WIRE
Tragic Death Comes to Aged Rowan Man Soon After He Marches in Memorial Parade.
Salsbury, May 9.—Nelson Allman, 76, was electrocuted by coming accidentally in contact with a live wire at the fair grounds.
He left his house in the fair grounds about 8 to close up the premises and when he didn't come back a search was instituted by his son but he was not found till this morning when his body was discovered.
Some one had tied a shoe and an iron spike to a wire and thrown it over a high voltage light wire, fastening the other end of the wire to section of barbed wire on the ground. It is believed this was done by some child without intent to injure anyone. Mr. Allman either stepped on or fell over the wire and his death was almost instantaneous.
An inquest was deemed unnecessary. The funeral and burial took place this afternoon.
Mr. Allman was a Confederate veteran and yesterday attended the reunion at the courthouse.
He leaves several grown children.
