Oran S. Poe of Rock Hill has been named manager of the 350-acre Winthrop college farm located just outside the city, officials of the school announced today.

Mr. Poe succeeds L.S. Lindler, who had leased the farm since September, 1937. Mr. Lindler requested that he be released from his contract January 15, and the college administration agreed to this action.

The farm is operated to provide fresh dairy and poultry supplies for the dining room at the South Carolina college for women which has a student body of approximately 1,600 girls.

Mr. Poe has been employed for the past two years with the Rock Hill Farm Equipment company. Previously, he had worked with the Soil Conservation service and the Federal Land bank. During the war, he worked at the shell manufacturing plant at Charlotte, N.C.

Mr. Poe ~~xxxx~~ was a student in the agronomy department at Clemson college when his studies were interrupted by service in the First World war. On his return from duty, he assisted his father in extensive farming operations near Rock Hill. He ~~xxx~~ also ~~xxxxxx~~ managed other farms totalling approximately 4,000 acres during this time.

Mr. Poe will move to the farm and assume management immediately, R. Brice Waters, administrative director at the college, said this morning.

College officials expressed their satisfaction at being able to secure the services of a person so well-equipped to operate the farm as Mr. Poe is.
