Author, **Professor to Discuss Latest** Book at 10th **DPT** Colloquium

ROCK HILL, S.C. - Professor Noliwe Rooks, associate director of Center for African American Studies at Princeton University, will be the keynote speaker for the 10th Dorothy Perry Thompson Colloquium in African American Studies and the African American Experience on March 31.

Rooks, who will speak at 7 p.m. in Plowden Auditorium, will discuss her most recent book, "White Money/Black Power: The History of African American Studies and the Crisis in Higher Education." In the work, Rooks delves into the complicated history of African American Studies, the Ford Foundation funding that saved many of these programs and the increasing number of white students in African American

Studies courses.

She teaches courses on migration and urbanization, urban education reform, race and social entrepreneurship, black women's studies and black popular culture. Rooks is the author of two other books: "Hair Raising: Beauty, Culture and African American Women," winner of the 1997 Choice Award for Outstanding Academic Book and selected by the Public Library Association as an Outstanding University Press Book in 1997, and "Ladies' Pages: African American Women's Magazines and the Culture That Made Them" (2004).

Sponsored by Winthrop's minor in African American Studies program, the colloquium honors late English professor Dorothy Perry Thompson, founder of Winthrop's minor in African American Studies. The colloquium, an approved cultural event for students, is free and open to the public.
