Inauguration **Events Culminate** with March 28 **Investiture** Ceremony

ROCK HILL, S.C. - Next week's events commemorating Winthrop University President Jamie Comstock's Inauguration will build to the March 28 Investiture Ceremony when Comstock is officially inaugurated as the university's 10th president.

The 2 p.m. ceremony in Byrnes Auditorium is the highlight of the various activities from March 24-29 celebrating the university, academics, student achievements and Comstock's leadership. Visit the Inauguration website to view a complete list of Inauguration events.

The Investiture Ceremony itself is among the oldest traditions in academia. The term, derived from a Latin phrase meaning "dress in robe," focuses on one who will literally don the university's insignia and regalia.

This **Investiture** will be much like other **Winthrop** academic ceremonies, such as Convocation and Commencement, in that they are formal and celebratory. Winthrop last held an Investiture Ceremony in 1990. Although Winthrop has had 10 presidents, Comstock is only the seventh to have participated in a formal Inauguration.

Attending the March 28 Investiture Ceremony will be representatives of more than 90 academic institutions from across the nation. Winthrop board members, local legislative delegation members, community leaders, and Comstock's family and close friends, along with Winthrop faculty, staff and students.

There are certain traditions that Winthrop has adopted from other institutions, namely the processional of representatives from other institutions marching in order of the year in which the institutions were founded. However, Investiture Ceremonies are very individualized events for each college/university and for each president.

This particular ceremony will allow for university greetings from individuals representing various Winthrop groups: alumni, the Winthrop Foundation, staff, students and faculty.

Providing reflections during the ceremony are three of Comstock's mentors: Morris Marx, president emeritus, University of Florida; Barry Pearson, provost and vice president for academic affairs, Purchase College; and Cathy Sandeen, vice president for education attainment and innovation,

American Council on Education.

After an installation by Board of Trustees members, Comstock will deliver a speech entitled "When We Are Called to Rise" that will outline her vision for Winthrop's future. Once the two-hour ceremony concludes, attendees are invited to the West Center for a community reception.

Here are other details to assist those attending the Investiture Ceremony:

- Visitors to campus may park in the Johnson Hall lot near the **West Center**. A trolley will be available to transport visitors from the **Johnson lot** to **Byrnes Auditorium** beginning at noon. Campus police officers will direct traffic and provide information.
- Byrnes Auditorium doors will open at 1 p.m. for the ceremony. Attendees should be seated by 1:45 p.m.
