ROCK HILL, S.C. – Winthrop students will play a leading role in a new Come-See-Me festival event on April 12.

Participants are asked to meet a Winthrop bus at 6:15 p.m. in the back parking lot behind Wells Fargo at the corner of White Street and Dave Lyle Boulevard in Rock Hill.

"Come see how the arts transform each place, and enjoy the ride," said Martin, an instructor in the Department of English. The event is free and will last until 7:30 p.m.

Winthrop students will be performing in all the presentations.
