ERECT ROAD SIGNS.

Number of Local Mercantile Establishments Erect Road Signs With Slogans about Chester.

Much has been said and written and laws have been passed which propose to regulate the construction of road signs to abolish them altogether. Some states have even gone so far as to eliminate all road signs by law. This has caused a serious situation as the chief objection to road signs has been their heterogeneous nature and placement by individuals, comparatively few road signs on the leading roads into Chester.
