The college transcript of Miss Li Nei-Yu of Peiping, China, submitted in application for admission to Winthrop, the South Carolina College for Women at Rock Hill, had on it \$1400. in postage (Chinese stamps equal to that amount in U.S. in the inflation that exists in China).

Rock Hill post office employees said that to send a similar letter to China from the United States (air mail registered) would cost about 70¢ in our money.

This illustrates either what run-away inflation could mean if it hit our country or how eader miss Li is to enter Winthrop, based on the way you look at it.
