ROCK HILL, SOUTH CAROLINA – A York County high school was awarded top honors March 27 at the **39th annual Model United Nations conference** at Winthrop University.

Held March 25-27, the program involved hundreds of students representing nearly 20 high schools from North and South Carolina. An awards ceremony capped two days of deliberations over world events.

The overall award – the **Winthrop Cup** – went to the China team, made up of students from **Nation Ford High School** of Fort Mill, South Carolina. **Lexington**

- **Political and Security Committee** – China, Nation Ford High; Iran, S.C. Governor's School for Science and Math; and Ukraine, Nation Ford High.
- **African Union** – Ethiopia, Pinewood Prep; Mozambique, Indian Land High; and Nigeria, South Pointe High.
- **Security Council** – Turkey, Pinewood Prep; China, Nation Ford High; and Angola, Fort Mill High.
- **General Assembly** – China, Nation Ford High; Iran, S.C. Governor's School for Science and Math; and Turkey, Pinewood Prep.

Winthrop students recognized as outstanding advisors to their high school delegations were: Kara Dunkelberg (Venezuela), Emily Boggs (Japan), Lindsay Gaynor (Canada), Benjamin Hernandez (Ghana), Zach Rardon (Germany) and Michael Ennis (Egypt).

This year's Secretariat is under the student leadership of **Khoi Tran**, secretary general; **Zachary Grieger**, director general; and **Tilysha McKenney**, coordinator general. The three organized the conference, contacted the high schools and worked on logistics for the three-day event, as well as coordinated Winthrop students' participation in the conference. Their advisor is **Professor Chris Van Aller** of the Department of Political Science; and the program assistant was **Kayla Davis**.
