ROCK HILL, S.C. – South Carolina lawmakers confirmed three [Winthrop University Board of Trustee](#) candidates who ran unopposed this week.

Donna Glenn Holley of Congressional District 2 and **Ashlye Wilkerson** '05 of Congressional District 6 were re-elected on April 2. **Randy Imler** '87, '00 will replace long-time member **Bob Thompson** in the at-large seat, which was added to the Board of Trustees in 2008.

The three will serve six-year terms.

Holley, who is from Columbia, S.C., and came on the board in 2004, works for the [South Carolina Legislative Council](#) and is involved in school and church-related activities.

Wilkerson of Columbia, S.C., is a Ph.D. candidate with the [University of South Carolina](#) and is an instructor at [University of South Carolina Upstate](#). She is a children's book author and former elementary school teacher with [Richland School District One](#).

Imler, of Tega Cay, S.C., is the executive director of the [Catawba Regional Council of Governments](#). He still plays an active role at Winthrop, where he conducts the [Winthrop University Collegiate Choir](#) and the [Winthrop University Jazz Voices](#). **Imler** earned bachelor's and master's degrees in music at Winthrop and is a past recipient (1999) of Winthrop's [Outstanding Young Alumni Award](#). He earned M.B.A. and D.M.A. degrees from the University of South Carolina.

Thompson, also of Rock Hill, will rotate off the board in June. The retired vice president of [Springs Industries](#) served on the Winthrop board for 19 years, from 1992-2005 and then 2008-14. He is a past chair of the [Winthrop Foundation](#) and a former member of the [Board of Visitors](#).
