Minutes and Seconds. At least twenty-five centuries before Christ the Babylonians had a system of notation, consisting of scri and soss, of which we have specimens, where we reckon 60 minutes to the hour and 60 seconds to the minute, or 3,600 seconds—that is, a soss of 12 hours to the hour. That we count 12 hours to the hour, 60 minutes to the hour and 60 seconds to the minute, are the equivalent of the Babylonian reckoning of 12 sosses to the soss and 60 minutes to the soss. All these numbers were far more common to the sosses, or 90. Our measure of time, however, of 60 minutes to the hour, was obtained them from the Babylonians, probably through the Phoenicians.

Ocean Cables. The diameter of the Atlantic cable varies according to the depth of the water, the character of the bottom on which it lies, the nature of the interference from anchors. It is as small as in midocean depths. There is little or no movement at the bottom, and it is important that the cable should not have great weight. A heavy cable in deep water would be difficult to bring up, and it is better to use a lighter type of cable used. The types are eight, and are called "shallow water" and "deep sea." The diameters of the commercial cables are: Shore end, two and eight-tenths inches; deep sea, one and three-quarters inches; deep sea, one inch.
