SEVENTY-FIVE BALES BASIS FOR CARLOAD

Railroads' War Board Fixes Amount of Cotton Shipments to South—Mideast District.
Washington, Sept. 2.—Fairfax Harrison, chairman of the railroads' war board, authorizes the following: With the movement of the cotton scheduled to begin this fall at a little when a combination of government and commercial business will be bringing tremendous pressure to bear upon the railroads, the commission on car service of the railroads' war board has issued instructions prohibiting the shipping of cotton in quantities of less than 65 bales per car and requiring as many more to be loaded as the size of the car furnished will permit.

Notice to this effect has just been sent to buyers of cotton together with a request that they place orders for their requirements on a basis of not less than 65 bales or multiples thereof. In the Southwest and Mississippi delta districts, the average car will load 65 bales and in the Southeast district the average car with load 75 bales. Consequently, buyers are asked to order in multiples of 75 from the Southeast districts.

FLYER RUNS INTO BIG SHELL IN AIR

He Loses Foot, but is Pulled Out Alive Through Hole in Aircraft.
Made a Record.
With the British Army in the Field, Aug. 30.—To have had a head-on collision with a big shell is an experience which has befallen few airmen in this war, but to have lived to tell the tale is all the more remarkable. This terrifying adventure recently befell one of the pilots of a noted British squadron. He lost a foot and suffered many severe bruises, but hopes to get into service again at no late date.
It was a Major who told me the story of the accident which nearly annihilated one of his best men.
"It was during the bombardment of the German lines," he said, "that this pilot went up. He had gone well over the German lines and had been strafed by their machine guns. During his flight back he came down to a much lower altitude, and was coming toward our lines at full speed when he was hit by a big shell from one of our own guns.
"It was a wonder that it did not explode immediately and blow him and his machine to atoms. Instead it raged two cylinders of his engine, raged downward and carried away his steering gear and then blew up under the tail of the machine. It disintegrated him and badly mangled his right foot, which afterward had to be amputated.
"As a consequence the accident itself was the performance of the airplane came to earth with him in it, turning his machine to shreds. He fell out of it through the hole which had been torn in it by the shell."
Noticed by Government Agent.

DEATH OF NEGRO STILL MYSTERY

York, Sept. 3.—After 30 minutes deliberation following the hearing of several hours testimony, the coroner's jury investigating the "Sims case," returned a verdict at 7 o'clock this evening declaring that W. T. Sims "came to his death on the morning of August 13 at the hands of a man whose name is unknown to the jury."
New warrants were immediately sworn out for all nine men in jail who would otherwise have been automatically released by this verdict and all witnesses were notified to appear before the grand jury next Monday morning, which meets here in regular session at the convening of the September term of court. It is impossible for the case to come to trial next week, however, as there will be no jury trials at this term of court.
The ninth arrest in connection with the lynching was made this afternoon when T. B. Penning, white, aged 50, a well known blacksmith of Sharon, was lodged in jail. He is the father of Fred Penning, the first white man arrested.
After a week's recess the inquest was resumed this morning before a crowd that packed the auditorium of the court house and utilized every inch of space in the aisles and doors for standing room, while possibly 200 were unable to gain admittance to the building. The greater part of the crowd was composed of negroes, several of them being members of the dead preacher's congregation.
Four negroes and a deaf and dumb young white man testified, but no evidence that would fix the identity of any of the lynchers was brought out.

Many Physicians May Be Needed for Military Duty

One-fifth of the total number of physicians in the United States will have to enroll for military duty if this war continues for another year, declares Dr. Franklin Martin, in Leslie's All but a small percentage of them have families to support and these and others are wholly dependent on the income of the hospital of the hospital for military service. The physician from thirty-five years to forty-five years of age, the age of greatest usefulness for military service, is at that critical period of his professional and financial development that two years of forced absence is liable to affect disastrously his whole career.

GERMANY NEEDS SUPPLIES THAT

Germanies in Mexico are buying copper and rubber, for which they pay more than the market price.

Germany needs rubber, copper, nickel and other metals which are essential to the manufacture of explosives, arms, munitions, and other indispensable war material. Undoubtedly she is striving in all possible ways to get this supply. Copper was found some weeks ago hidden in tanks of oil on a neutral ship at this port, and nine sailors of Belgian relief ship were arrested here last week for attempting to carry rubber across the Atlantic coast. The German navy recently lost her foreign supply of nickel when the Norwegian captain that had been selling the metal to her came into the possession of the British Government by purchase.
