Rock Hill, Feb. 1--Dr. Frederick Taylor Wilson, author-lecturer, will speak at Winthrop college assembly on Tuesday (February 4) at 12 o'clock noon in the main auditorium, college officials announced today.

A nationally recognized authority on American presidents and the Constitution of the United States, Doctor Wilson will speak here on "The Birth of Our Liberties". A discussion of the Constitution and the men who made it, this address has been heard at many schools, state legislatures, and civic clubs.

Doctor Wilson is a native of Tennessee, was graduated from Vanderbilt university, and for a time was located in Texas where he taught history and law and practiced law.

His most recent years have been devoted to writing and lecturing, except for time spent as ~~gaxx~~ government attorney in Washington and Chicago. His addresses have appeared often in the Congressional Record and many of his ~~writings~~ writings have been transcribed into braille for the blind. He has been awarded honorary degrees of Doctor of Laws, and Doctor of Letters.
