Live stock keeps coming to market and we have to keep buying it and putting it through our plants whether

conditions are good or poor.

Swift & Campany has no control over the qua a ity of live stock shipped to market. Live-stock producers ship their animals to the big stock-yards markets wie rethey are sold through commission iden who represent the shippers,

We cannot hold dressed becf, lamb, mutton, veal, i esh per c, or any other fresh perishable meats, but have to sell them at the prevailing market prices within a few days. If we try to sell at half a cent under the prevailing prices, retailers would naturally buy from us as long as our supply lasted, and that supply would supply lasted, and that supply would be used /up very quickly. On the other hand, if we try to sell for half a cent bigher than the market prices, the retailers, who shop around, would buy from our competities and we would have our fresh meat left on our lands. We have to sell our products every day at prevailing market prices whatever those price
