These are just a few titles from the approximately 190 projects that will be displayed, presented and performed at the **Third Annual Showcase of Undergraduate Research and Creative Endeavors (SOURCE)** on Friday, April 21, at Winthrop University.

This year’s SOURCE showcase features projects from more than 25 departments—including the sciences, English, mass communication, mathematics, history, political science, social work, psychology and more—and includes live performances on the Barnes Recital Hall stage and student work in Rutledge Gallery.

SOURCE celebrates and encourages all facets of undergraduate research, which is considered a “high-impact practice” as identified by the American Association of Colleges and Universities.
