WAR RISK PREMIUM GREATLY REDUCED

Uncle Sam Believes Effective Methods Have Been Adopted to Handle Submarines.

Washington, Oct. 6.—A reduction of 25 per cent in premiums for insurance of American vessels and cargoes traversing the war zone was announced today by the government War-Risk Insurance Bureau. The Secretary of the bureau was officially announced, because of the decrease in the risks. Unofficially it was regarded as the government's expression of its opinion in terms of dollars and cents that the boats have passed the zenith in their campaign of frightfulness.

Indications have not been lacking for the past three weeks that the government intended to revise its war risk insurance rates in the light of reduced effectiveness of German submarines. It hardly was thought, however, that the cut would be so large.

The announcement said that the Treasury announced today that the bureau of war risk has reduced its rates on all American steamers and cargoes traversing the war zone from 6 1/2 per cent to 5 per cent.

NEGROES AT ALL CAMPS.

Baker Purposes to Train a Complete Unit at Each of the 15 Cantonnments.

Washington, Oct. 6.—Plenty of room available at the national army cantonnments, due to the large number of men to be withdrawn to fill up the National Guard and other post camps available at the national army again modified its plans for training negro troops of the national army force. It is now the purpose, Secretary Baker said, to train a complete unit of negroes at each of the sixteen cantonnments, instead of training them only at cantonnments to which a considerable number report.

The size of the unit will depend upon the number of negroes drafted from the divisional areas which supplies each cantonnement, but where there is a large surplus, men will be sent to posts with smaller numbers for consolidation with the training unit.

REVENUE LAW JOKER

DOUBLES INCOME TAX

Salaries or Earnings of More Than \$6,000 Must Pay 5 Per Cent Additional.

Washington, Oct. 4.—Buggies and professional men, and salaried men as well as those with incomes of more than \$6,000 a year face a war-profit tax of 5 per cent in addition to the income surtax, under the provision of a section which has been discovered in the war-tax bill. The section was inserted by the conferees while they were working in secret session to bring out the perfected bill.

The war-profit tax section lays a tax of 8 per cent on the net income of a business or trade when it exceeds \$1000 a year. In the case of a corporation and \$6000 in the case of a partnership or an individual. A subsequent article, just discovered, states that the words "trade or business" includes "professions and occupations."

CONGRESS MEMBERS LEAVING FOR HOME

Committee to Begin Today Probe of Alleged Treasonable Utterances of Senator.

Washington, Oct. 7.—Trailed by echoes of six months' impenitent achievement, the annual session from the capital, following adjournment yesterday, was in full swing tonight. Most members were either the study at home or speeding that way.

Because of the brief recess until the new session opens December 3, some members of both branches are remaining here. Others will stay a few days to clear up a few private and public odds and ends, including matters of special interest to constituents.

Investigation by a senate privileges and elections committee of Senator La Follette's alleged "disloyal utterances" on the floor, September 29, before the Non-Partisan League, promises to be brief. The committee, headed by Senator Pomeroy, with Senators Walsh, James Dillingham and Fall, will hold a preliminary meeting tomorrow to determine procedure. They expect to conclude the inquiry within a week or ten days and report to the senate.

Whether public hearings will be held is to be determined tomorrow. Senator La Follette and former Secretary Bryan may be the principal witnesses. As to whether Senator Bryan knew the Lusitania had munitions aboard at New York and urged President Wilson to detain the vessel, as stated by the senator, is the chief point of fact at issue. Mr. Bryan already has publicly denied the statement.
