HOW TO MAKE ROSES GROW

SET IN GOOD SOIL, PREFER-

ABLY A CLAYEY ONE

(eep Well Gultivated - Cut Back Each Year and Gather the Flowers

Roses may be grown in almost any kind of soil, but thrive better where there is a clay subsoil with a good soil above this. The rose should be plowed or spaded at least tweive inches deep, thus mixing some of the clay deep, thus mixing some of the clay can be subsoiled by the spade of the clay the spade of the clay to each p int, thoroughly mixed with the soil.
