COTTON CONTRACT SUIT IS FILED

ALSO CASE AGAINST SOUTHERN POWER CO.

Cotton Case will be of Much Interest to Chester Farmers.

The following article, which appears in the New York and Courier will be of much interest to the people of Chester County, in relation to the failure to deliver cotton at contract prices. The case is exciting much interest and the outcome will be watched with much interest. The article follows:
 A case growing out of an alleged contract to deliver cotton, the contract, so the plaintiffs claim, having been made last May, the allegation being out, has been filed in the United States Circuit Court by the cotton firm of Alexander Sprunt and Son against Hurst-Streator Company of Chesterfield. The price to be paid for the cotton, so the plaintiffs allege, was 10 cents for middling, and that at the expiration of the contract, the price was 14 1/4 cents per pound, and that the difference in the price totaled \$6,146.86 on the 300 bales called for in the contract, less the amount delivered for which amount the suit is brought. The outcome of the case will be watched with much interest by farmers generally. It is known that some farmers lost by making contracts before the season opened, as the price of cotton took a phenomenal rise from the start, and the high price was not foreseen.

The complaint of Sprunt and Son is as follows:
 "That on the 17th day of May, 1909, the defendant executed its contract in writing with the plaintiff, whereby it sold and undertook and agreed to deliver to the plaintiff before the 15th day of September, 1909, 300 bales of middling cotton to weigh 600 pounds each, 6 per cent more or less, for which the plaintiffs were to pay the defendant the sum of ten cents per pound for middling and 1 1/2 cent difference for grades above American classification."
 "That the defendant has failed and refused to comply with its contract and has delivered thereon only the amount of five thousand, three hundred and sixty-eight pounds of middling cotton, leaving a balance of four thousand six hundred and thirty-two pounds undelivered, and the plaintiff having contracted and sold the said cotton to the customers, were

compelled, in order to replace the cotton so withheld by the defendant, to go upon the open market, after having first demanded that defendant deliver the cotton, and buy said cotton at the price it was being offered in case of said contract, which price was fourteen and one fourth (14 1/4) cents per pound at Cheraw, S. C., where the same was to be delivered, causing the plaintiffs by their breach of contract a loss of six thousand, one hundred and forty-six dollars and 85 cents (6,146.85) dollars, which sum has been duly demanded of the defendant and it has refused to pay the same.

Wherefore plaintiff they demand judgment against the defendant for \$6,146.85.

A suit, in which the damages are fixed at \$10,000, has been filed in the United States Circuit Court against the Southern Power Company, of Chester, by Jane Kennedy, administratrix of Abe Kennedy, deceased, resulting from the death of Abe Kennedy, who, it is alleged, was killed while in the employ of the company, through the insufficient strength of a piece of machinery which fell on Kennedy while he was at work. According to the complaint Kennedy was engaged in the work of excavating and drilling, and while defendants were attempting to remove a load of stone with a derrick, the boom pole broke and the load of stone and the pole struck the man, from effects of which he died shortly afterward. The plaintiff alleges that the place where Kennedy worked was unsafe and dangerous, that the derrick should not have been operated above him, and that the derrick was of insufficient strength.
