In 1912, however, Mr. Tillman opposed the re-election of Mr. Blease, and he is now a member of the United States Senate.

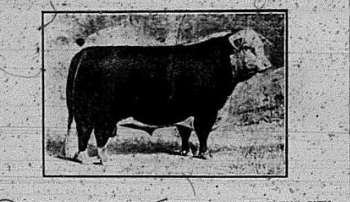
The year Mr. Blease announced that he would be a candidate for re-election in 1918 against Mr. Tillman. Mr. Tillman has announced that he will run in 1921.

In accordance with the law, tax books for the return of all real and personal property for the year 1918 will be open on Tuesday, Nov. 19, 1918, and will be closed on Friday, Nov. 29th, 1918, after which the fifty per cent penalty will be attached to all delinquents. All real estate to be returned, 1918 being real estate year.
Sec. 1, Art. 383, of the General Assembly of South Carolina, provides as follows: "It shall be the duty of all persons to make returns of all personal property and real and personal property."
