TAX RETURN NOTICE FOR 1918.

In accordance with the law, tax books for the return of all real and personal property for the year 1918 will be open on Tuesday, Jan. 1st, 1919, and will be closed on Feb. 20th, 1919, after which the fifty per cent penalty will be attached to all delinquent tax returns to be returned. 1918 being real estate year.

Sec. 1 of Act 382, of the General Assembly of South Carolina, provides as follows: "It shall be the duty of all persons to make returns of all personal property and return all new property that has changed hands, real and personal property."

For the greater convenience of persons residing in different portions of the county, I will be at the following points on the dates indicated, after which I will be at my office continuously prepared to take returns.

All sales between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years, except Confederate soldiers over the age of 50 years, are liable to a poll tax of \$1.00 and all persons so liable are specially requested to give the number of their respective school districts in making their returns.

Only taxing returns at the various places, my assistant will be at the office and will take your returns.
