We do not think there is any doubt but that the General Assembly, which will meet in Columbia next month, will be called upon to consider issuing bonds for the purpose of building hard-surfaced roads in South Carolina.

Have you ever thought about the number of miles automobiles and trucks travel on the highways of South Carolina each year, or how much money is spent for gasoline?

The average used by each automobile and truck for the year is around 500 gallons which sold for approximately \$115. Figuring the average mileage as ten miles per gallon, and automobiles and trucks have traveled more than forty-five million miles on the highways of South Carolina during the present year.

It will cost not less than \$20,000 a mile to build a hard-surfaced road. The interest on this alone would be close to \$1,000 per mile per year and if \$500 were spent on the average each day road a year's worth could be kept in boulevard condition.

We hear much about the fifty million dollar bond issue in North Carolina, but we people of South Carolina must consider the fact that North Carolina exceeds us in population and wealth and is therefore much more able to pay taxes on large bond issues.

TAX RETURN NOTICE FOR 1923

In accordance with the law, tax books for the return of real and personal property for the year 1923 will be open on Monday, Jan. 1, and will remain open until Friday, 20, 1923, after which the fifty percent penalty will be attached to all delinquent returns.

Rec. 1, Art. 383, of the General Assembly of South Carolina, provides as follows: "It shall be the duty of the assessor to make a return of all personal property and return all new property that has changed hands since the previous year."
